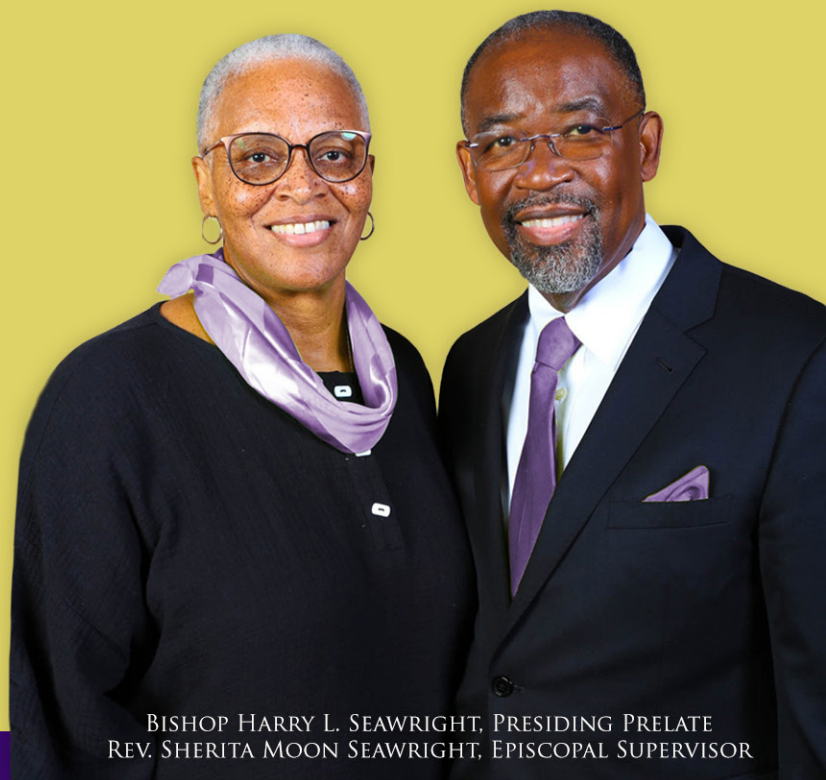
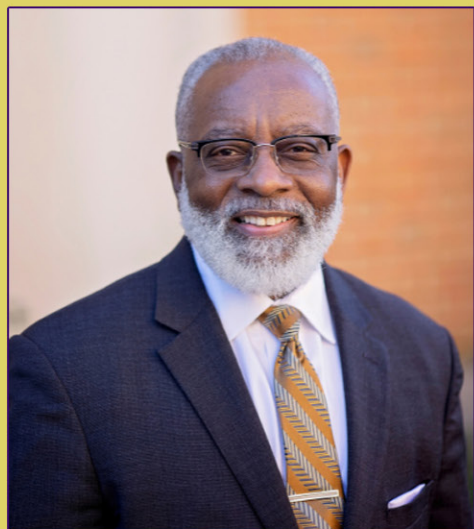

Rev. Dr. Ronald D. Sterling has been a pastor in the African Methodist Episcopal Church for twenty-five years and serves as the senior pastor of Saint John AME Church, Downtown Birmingham.

He is the chair of the 9th Episcopal District of the AME Church's Board of Examiners and a second-year instructor at the Northwest Alabama Annual Conference. He served as a contract chaplain in the Pastoral Care Department at the UAB Hospital Health Care System for years.

Sterling is a part-time staff member of the Beeson Divinity School at Samford University. He serves as the director of Student Services and as a lecturer in Pastoral Studies and Spiritual Formation. As part of the Nichols-Thomas-Grady Clergy Institute team, Sterling serves as the dean. Also, he strongly advocates effective discipleship and spiritual formation training in both the church and the seminary. He has conducted workshops in this field at the local, district, and Episcopal Church levels. Sterling is also known for his passion for the community's hurting, which allows him to minister to the lost, homeless, and brokenhearted. Also, many couples have sought Sterling for his biblical counseling, especially for pre and marital guidance.

Sterling has received several awards, including the Outstanding Pastor of the Year Award for his religious and community services by the Greater Titusville Civitan Club; and the "Pastor of the Year" award by the 9th Episcopal District Lay Organization. He is also the co-director of the daily Warriors on the Wall Prayer Ministry, which he helped establish—a vision of Bishop Harry L. Seawright, Presiding Prelate of the 9th Episcopal District of the AME Church.

He and his wife, Kim, live in Pelham, Alabama, and have been married for almost 50 years. They are the parents of three adult children and the grandparents of eight grandchildren.
